

Gregg County Special Education Shared Service Arrangement and its member districts of Sabine ISD, Spring Hill ISD, and White Oak ISD are committed to the ongoing process of identifying, locating and evaluating the learning needs of children ages birth through 21 who have suspected disabilities. This process, called "Child Find," also extends to children in private schools and home schools located within the boundaries of the school districts to an extent equal to a proportionate share of federal funding. The districts offer comprehensive special education services to eligible students ages three through 21 years of age and to children from birth through age 21 who have a hearing or visual impairment. Children from birth to age three with other disabilities will be referred to appropriate agencies for services. All referrals are considered confidential, and if your child qualifies, special education instruction and related services are provided at no cost. The parent, legal guardian, or surrogate parent retains the right to refuse services and are provided other procedural safeguards under federal and state law.

Full and individual evaluations are provided for all areas of suspected disabilities and include learning disabilities, speech and language disorders, physical impairments, vision and/or hearing impairments, intellectual impairments, emotional disturbances, autism/pervasive developmental disorders, health impairments, and/or traumatic brain injuries.

A free, appropriate, public education with a full continuum of special education services and related services is available.
