House Bill 5 (HB5), passed by the Texas Legislature in 2013, requires each district to evaluate and designate a performance rating for 9 factors for the district and each of its campuses based on criteria set by a local committee. The law requires that each district and each campus be assigned a rating of exemplary, recognized, acceptable or unacceptable. The district and campus performance ratings must be reported annually to TEA and made publically available.
